ALICE STILL IN THE CROSSCURRENTS

One Step Forward, Two Steps Back

In Washington, 35% of households lived paycheck to paycheck in 2022. This included nearly 312,012 households in poverty and another 747,889 who were **ALICE** – **A**sset Limited, Income **C**onstrained, Employed – earning above poverty but less than the cost of basics.

While wages grew, three other factors – inflation, loss of pandemic supports, and a decade of falling behind – combined to keep ALICE trapped.
